MANIFESTO PRESENTATION IN THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT 23 JANUARY 2024 | 3 P.M. - 5 P.M.

Start WE-Up - Let's Ignite Women's Entrepreneurship stems from the need to find a common voice to enhance women's entrepreneurship in a national and European dimension. A project with a double aim: to break down all those obstacles (social, bureaucratic, legislative) that hinder women from getting involved in the professional and working world and to contribute to the single European definition of women's enterprise. A Manifesto, therefore, encapsulated in that "WE" which lends itself to a dual interpretation: the word itself, WE, which is meant to be very broad and inclusive, and the anagram of Women Empowerment.

The project route found its first manifestation last 18 November at the MAXXI Museum in Rome, where a masterclass was held, attended by women entrepreneurs, institutions, associations, politicians and experts on gender equality, in which the opportunities of the PNRR, the Italian and European regulation of women's entrepreneurship and the gap in women's education for STEM subjects were the central topics.

In February 2023, two technical round tables were held between trade associations on the one hand and social associations on the other, aimed at determining the main points to be included in the Manifesto, for a document that encompasses most of the multilateral souls of women.

A synergetic perspective between the increasingly central and innovative female entrepreneur in the main socio-economic contexts, and the woman as a social figure, mainstay of the family, fearless, responsible and attentive, still lacking in terms of protection.

After several months of drafting, sharing and validation, the Manifesto was publicly presented at a press conference on 24 May in the Hall of the European Representation in Italy, also thanks to the valuable support of the European Parliament, which is a partner in the entire project.

The document has also taken on an institutional guise thanks to the support of Unioncamere and the patronage of the Ministry of Enterprises and Made in Italy, following the sharing and enhancement of the Manifesto within the Impresa Donna Committee, within which sit numerous associations representing Italian companies, which are joining the list of supporters.


